A VERY OLD VETERAN DEAD!

Captain John Davis Was Nearly One Hundred Years of Age—Three Canadian.

Capt. John Davis died on Thursday night at the home of his daughter, Mrs. William Kirkendall, 309 Bathurst-st., Toronto. He was born in Western Ontario, June 23, 1803, and until the past few months he had always been hale and hearty and the possessor of a wonderful memory.

When the war of 1812 broke out he fled with his father, a U.E. Loyalist, near Simcoe, in Norfolk County. He soon afterwards moved to Barton, which was then a

wilderness. When the rebellion of 1837 broke out he was a volunteer under the command of Capt. Servos. He saw the burning of the Caroline fleet down the Niagara Rapids, and was one of the two aides-de-camp who escorted Sir Francis Bond Head from Chippewa to Niagara on his way to Toronto. On his return he was entrusted with despatches by Sir Allan McNab, then commander-in-chief.

In the Fenian raid of 1866 he was one of the first to enroll in the home guard. Capt. Davis leaves three daughters, Mrs. Kirkendall, and Mrs. John Irving, 87 St. Patrick-st., Toronto, and Mrs. J. W. Davis, 1400 Ave. Road, near the corner of the city. The funeral will take place at Mount Pleasant Cemetery to-day.

JAMES CALLAHAN ON TRIAL.

The Alleged Kidnapper of Young Cudahy Presented a Changed Appearance Yesterday.

EVIDENCE MOSTLY ABOUT CROWE,

But One Man Testified to Having Seen Callahan the Day Before the Kidnapping.

Omaha, Neb., April 26.—James Callahan, on trial charged with complicity in the kidnapping of Edward Cudahy, Jr., appeared in court to-day well dressed and presenting a greatly changed appearance. B. K. Munshaw, who lives near the Melrose Hill house, was the first witness. He identified a picture of Crowe as that of a man who came to his house about three weeks before the kidnapping and asked who owned the Schneider house. The man came back later and said he had rented the house. Munshaw said he saw Crowe there on the day before the kidnapping, and talked with him. On the night of the kidnapping the dogs barked late in the evening, and he went out by the well and saw a buggy or spring wagon driven past. It drew up to the steps of the Schneider house. He was downhall from there, and the parties were outstayed against the sky. He saw what he took to be two men go into the house, and he thought the parties were moving in some of their goods. Crowe, Munshaw testified, was accompanied by a woman when he called the first time in a buggy, and inquired about the house.

RARE BIRD SHOT NEAR TORONTO.

A Swallow-Tail Kite Found by a Local Taxidermist Near Highland Creek.

A well-known ornithologist, in a chat with a World reporter yesterday, said that while coming up from Belleville on the G.T.R. train last Tuesday night a Toronto taxidermist got on at Port Union. He had with him a bird which he had shot on the heights of Highland Creek, and was unlike anything found before in Ontario. The bird was what is known as the "swallow-tail kite," usually found in great numbers around the Isthmus of Panama. It was about two feet long, with a beautiful white head and tail feathers like a swallow. In color, it was black and white. It lives on mammals, reptiles and the eggs of large insects. McIlwraith's "Birds of Ontario" does not mention the swallow-tail kite at all, and the gentleman, speaking to The World, is of opinion that it was driven from the Southern States by the storm of Saturday, which came pretty generally from the central portion of the continent. Along the lower Mississippi the bird is fairly common. It is said the gentleman who has the bird is Mr. Pearce of West Queen-street.

SHOT IN THE SPINE.

Brookville Boy Is in a Fair Way to Die—A Grandson of Benedict.

Brookville, April 26.—Harold Major, a 16-year-old lad of Prescott, was out riding shooting with two other boys in the woods, when one of his companions fell, discharging his gun. The bullet lodged in Major's back, near the spine, and he may die. Henry Arnold, grandson of Benedict Arnold, famous in American history, died here yesterday, aged 88. SCHOOL GAMES JUNE 22.

The defendant is charged with the infringement of two patents on methods of distributing and regulating alternating currents of electricity by secondary generators. The decision is in favor of defendants, and is important inasmuch as numerous companies throughout the country use the same methods.
