Sir Wilfrid Laurier's "Unjust Reproach" Cabinet Ministers' "Malevolent Attack"

Ex-Minister Tarte Declares He Was Made a Scapegoat by Liberal Party Ever Since He Took Office—"I Would Not Desire My Worst Enemy to Have to Travel the Road Which I Have Been Forced to Cover."

Montreal, Oct. 23.—(Special).—Hon. Mr. Tarte has taken possession of the editorial chair of La Patrie and his first article, a very moderate one, is called:

A WORD TO THE COUNTRY.

The incident is closed to the satisfaction of many people. The Conservatives rejoice at my resignation—that is legitimate. They think it will increase their chances of success—what then would an opposition exist on if they did not have hopes? Some of our political friends say my retirement with content. Others, and I think them with all my heart, have shown me the warmest sympathy. I am decidedly one of the most interested parties in the matter. I declare myself content. I leave the Cabinet without regret, without pain, without bitterness against anybody. I have tried to do my duty. For more than six years I have been in the department of Public Works. I labored hard during the day. I worked late at night. I had at heart the advancement of the great cause of our national means of transportation. This has been the basic principle of my administration of affairs. There are no indispensable men. I will easily be replaced. There are men in the cabinet who will give Sir Wilfrid Laurier their undivided support. I wish that my successor may do more and do better than I did.

"I see that some reproach Sir Wilfrid Laurier for the tone of the letter which he addressed to me. The Prime Minister is, in fact, a man of great ability and high character. His words are by no means harsh. I have grown old enough to take the circumstances into consideration. The Prime Minister had no right to tell me that I had failed in loyalty towards my colleagues. In using the language which I recently used on the fiscal question, I was only expressing my own opinion."

NO WORK FOR SOME STRIKERS

Engineers and Carpenters Find That There Are No Vacancies at the Mines.

RESUMPTION OF WORK NOT GENERAL

Water, Accumulated Gas, and Dangerous Ropes Prevent Miners Going Back.

Wilkes-Barre, Pa., Oct. 23.—The resumption of mining through the anthracite region was not as general as was expected. Unlooked for difficulties were encountered in the case of water and accumulated gas, and dangerous ropes which threatened to fall and entomb the workers were also discovered in many of the collieries.

The mine superintendents would take no chances, and the mining of coal was put off until the water and gas were removed and the ropes replaced. In some cases, it will take weeks before the mines can be put in full operation.

In quite a few of the collieries, the machinery and everything connected with the mining operation is given as a little less than two-thirds of the total number, but the output of coal was less than half the normal.

As was to be expected, there was more or less dissatisfaction among old employees over the reopening of the mines. Where it was decided not to resume work for a few days, the men took it as a sign that the coal companies did not want their services, and many complaints reached President Mitchell's headquarters.

It looks as if the union engineers will get back their old places. At least every mine where the striking engineers made application to return to work, they were told that there were no vacancies. A large number of carpenters are also in the coal fields.

ENGINEERS MAY STRIKE

Chicago, Oct. 23.—President Morton of the International Association of Stationary Engineers and Firemen stated today that all members of the association all over the country will be ordered to refuse to handle any anthracite coal until every member affected by the anthracite coal strike is reinstated on the basis on which the 14,000, registered has a membership which this organization is in a position to shut hard coal out of all cities, where it has local unions, and such action will be taken, if necessary, for the protection of the public.

NO MEDIATION IN STRIKE

London, Oct. 23.—Impressed with the result of President Roosevelt's intervention in the coal strike in the United States, Mr. Field, president of the Irish Coal Trades Union, and the Cattle Owners' Association, invited the president of the Board of Trade, George Balfour, to adopt a similar course in the case of the outstanding Fenian railway dispute. Mr. Balfour, however, replied that the circumstances of the Fenian dispute were entirely different from those in the American strike, and said there was no prospect of official intervention would tend to make a settlement.

To this unjust reproach I have the right to oppose the numerous speeches which I made, in the same sense, during the last few years.

"I did not organize a campaign in Ontario. I went into that province last year and this summer at the urgent invitation of the agricultural societies of the Chambers of Commerce, of municipal members. I had been represented during the elections of 1900 especially, as a man who was loyal to His Majesty. I seized every possible opportunity to dispel that prejudice, which had no justification for its existence. If those who held the strings of the political organization in Ontario in 1900 had not prevented me from going to speak in that province, I am sure that in the past of the last electoral battle there would not have been the same in many counties."

"I appeal on this point to the Liberal party, to our friends in the opposition, to the press, to the public. There is loyalty and 'fair play' among the English population. If I had been heard, I would not have been condemned. I had an ardent desire not to show the country in a bad light. I was a loyal subject of His Majesty to foot over my head. I went to Ontario. I opened a great many fairs. I spoke there. I discussed the questions of transportation and the tariff as I had done in the past. It is possible that I overshadowed somebody, that unintentionally I wounded some susceptibilities."

"I have been bitterly reproached for meddling with things which were under the control of other departments than my own. From my seat in parliament I will ask my colleagues to reply to me for this malevolent attack. I have been for nearly 30 years a journalist. I have traveled much through Canada. It was natural that people should apply to me. The French people in various sections of the confederation have often entrusted me with difficult and delicate missions. I have fulfilled them to the best of my ability. I have, in all this, endeavored to serve the country."

SIR WILFRID IN MONTREAL

Now Mulock and Sutherland Mentioned for Public Works.

Montreal, Oct. 23.—This was a busy day at the Windsor, where Sir Wilfrid arrived at noon, sending soon after for ex-Mayor Prefontaine. It is said, in fact, that the member for Terrebonne stands a good chance of getting the Speakership should Mr. Brodeur become a Minister, and perhaps the ex-Mayor will become the Minister instead.

No announcement may be expected, however, for a few days, as Sir Wilfrid will go to Quebec tomorrow, and then pass several days at Arthabaska.

It is also whispered that Quebec will lose the portfolio of Public Works, and that either Sir William Mulock or Hon. J. Sutherland will be the next choice. This, however, will be squarely opposed by Mr. Tarte, who his paper gives currency to the rumor.

The Globe's Ottawa correspondent makes the following luminous reference to the Tarte episode: One of the latest reports arising out of the present situation is that Hon. Jas. Sutherland will take charge of the Department of Public Works, and be succeeded in the Marine and Fisheries Department by a member from Quebec. The fact that Mr. Sutherland is at present acting as Minister of Public Works gives color to the report.

NOBODY CARED FOR TARTE.

He Was Run After Only Because He Was a Minister, Says Borden.

Montreal, Oct. 23.—"I am of the opinion that the people who ran after Mr. Tarte did so because they looked upon him as a strong Minister, and that he would represent their views in a vigorous manner. But since he has retired it is quite likely that the same people will look elsewhere." was the statement made to-day by Sir Frederick Borden, and also by the fact that the Minister of Militia is the first of Mr. Tarte's colleagues to express an opinion on the result of the ex-Minister's retirement.

STARVED TO DEATH.

Captain of Steamer Belmar Letting a Man Desert.

Parry Sound, Ont., Oct. 23.—On Sunday last the body of an unknown man was found in the bush on Parry Island, near Depot Harbor. The man had died from starvation and exposure. An inquiry was held yesterday, and adjourned till the 20th for further evidence.

The body appears to be that of a seaman from the steamer Yuma, an American vessel of Cleveland, Ohio, which was about 22, medium height, complexion, black moustache. Evidence was given at the inquest that the man had been a bartender formerly employed at Ashtabula. He had been given the captain of the Yuma, brought in delirious tremors, and had been whittled in iron, whilst on board. The case appears to be one of neglect on the part of the captain of the Yuma, allowing the man to desert whilst in a demoralized condition, and afterwards leaving the port without notifying the local authorities as to the man's disappearance.

THANKOFFERING TO GOD.

Why John D. Rockefeller Gives \$500,000 to a College.

New York, Oct. 23.—At the meeting to-day of the Teachers' College Trustees of Columbia University, it was announced that John D. Rockefeller had offered to give \$500,000 to the college, provided that the college could also \$250,000 to pay the debt of the institution, and \$250,000 in addition to that amount. The announcement was made that Mr. Rockefeller takes the gift as a "thank-offering" for the preservation of himself, his family and household from the fire which recently destroyed his country home at Pocantico Hills.
