Kills Three Savages and Then Dropped by Boy With Rifle. BUTTE, Mont., Oct. 22.-Game Warden W. F. Scott and Deputy Warden

Henry A. Vass have arrived with the remains of Deputy Game Warden Chas. B. Peyton, killed in a fight with Indias Sunday in the Swan River Country while attempting to arrest them for transgressing the game laws of the state.

The deputy game warden was sho by a 13-year-old Indian lad who had been behind the horses of the Red Skins and not been noticed by Peyton When Peyton told the Indians they were under arrest, one of them grabbed the officer by the neck. Peyton shook ilm off and advised them to be peace-ul. Another Indian then uttered a war hoop, pulled his rifle and was shoot when Peyton dropped him in his tracks with a bullet. Two others Indians attempted to get their guns unsheathed, but Peyton killed them before they could get into action. Rudolph, the sheriff's companion, observed the little Indian lad kneeling between the horses aiming a Reeling between the horses aiming at Peyton and he fired at the Red Skin at the same time that the latter fired at the officer. Peyton was mortally shot and the Indian boy toppled over dead.
