He had grown a grape-fruit tree which this year had pro-duced a dozen of the fruit, a great curiosity to the district. The leaves of the paw-paw tree ware said to make tough meat tender, and Mr. Ross said when his tree was fully leafed he took one of the large leaves and wrapped a piece of very tough meat in it, and in half an hour cooked it, and it was very tender.
