MILCH COWS SLOW No Difference in Cost of Sheep, Lambs and Calves.

Receipts of live stock at the Union stock yards yesterday consisted of: 28 cars, 401 cattle, 34 calves, 503 hogs, 68 sheep and lambs.

Trade in cattle was strong at the Union stock yards yesterday, at prices practically the same as were obtained on Monday. The run was exceptionally light, there being only 401 fresh cattle and 118 left-overs on sale.
