TORONTO MAN OBTAINS BIG RUSSIAN CONTRACT

Montreal, June 25.—A. Sloan, of Toronto, with offices in the Drummond Building here, along with F. W. Boyer, also in the same building, have completed an order for several million dollars' worth of Canadian machinery and food stuffs with C. A. K. Martens, Russian Soviet trade commissioner in the United States, according to information received this morning from a reliable source.

RUSSIA'S NEW BID FOR EUROPEAN RECOGNITION

London, June 25.—Leonid Krassin, the Bolshevik minister of trade and commerce, says The Evening Standard today, told a trade delegation that visited him this afternoon that: "If the Russian Soviet government was recognized by the European governments there was no doubt that Russia would recognize the external debt contracted by Russia under the imperial regime."
