Continued From Page 1. Mrs. Mary Anne Bigley, widow of Daniel Bigley, is an eminently respectable woman of advanced years. The Bigley family has lived in and around Woodstock for many years. The father of Elizabeth was a farmer at Woodstock, four miles east of Woodstock. Those who knew him say he was a plain, honest man. He worked his farm and supported his family to the best of his ability.

A correspondent went to the Bigley home on Dundas street. It is a plain two-story dwelling house, differing in no way from those that surround it. It was met at the door by Mrs. Campbell, the sister.

"Is this the home of Mrs. Mary Anne Bigley," he asked. "No, she is at home."

"Are you a daughter of Mrs. Bigley?" the reporter asked. "I am."

"And a sister of Mrs. Chadwick of Cleveland?" "Yes, sir."

Questioned further Mrs. Campbell was extremely reticent. "I never knew that my sister went under the name of De Vere," she said.

Her Beautiful Diamonds. Mrs. Chadwick may have had some looking of coming disaster, for she left Cleveland and has since secluded herself at the Holland House, New York. It is said that she maintains a suite of rooms at that exclusive hotel the year round. Her husband and his daughter, by a previous marriage are travelling abroad.

Mrs. Chadwick has herself been much abroad. On landing in New York on Oct. 13, 1902, she paid duty on \$10,000 worth of diamonds and other gems, but on being asked about a \$100,000 diamond and ruby necklace which had been bought there and had been reported stolen, she said she had never seen it.

It was admitted at the Holland House yesterday, according to a dispatch, that Mrs. Chadwick had been in the city for several weeks, it was said, and was then under the care of a physician. To a reporter who called Mrs. Chadwick sent down word that she was too ill to see anyone. In response to a note sent to the apartment she returned an emphatic denial of the statements published in New York and in Cleveland to the effect that she was ever known as Lydia De Vere, that she ever served a term in the Ohio Penitentiary and that she ever made use of the long list of aliases accredited to her by the newspapers of Cleveland.

"It is a wicked falsehood," she wrote adding that a great wrong had been done to her and other innocent persons.
