able to give; and, also, to report themselves to the District Secretary whenever he may visit any part of their district, that they may have the benefit of his suggestions, and may assist him in his public meetings, etc., should he need assistance.

10. Colporteurs when on duty for the Society, are required to abstain from taking part in public political meetings or discussions, and also to avoid, as far as possible, points of controversy between different Christian denominations or Churches.

11. The general work and duties of Colporteurs are, to circulate the Word of God among ali classes and creeds of the community, and, as opportunity offers, to read the Scriptures, hold religious converse and prayer with families or individuals. When the great object of the Society can be promoted by religious services and addresses to public assemblies these may be held. But in proceedings of this character the Committee desire that Colporteurs seek the countenance and co-operation of Ministers of the Gospel, without distinction of denomination.
