RAND GOLD OUTPUT

The gold output of the Rand is steadily expanding. The July yield of 584,000 ounces constitutes a new monthly record. This means that approximately \$2,500,000 new gold is being shipped to the London open market every week, where it becomes immediately available for the great banks of Europe. Less than one month elapses from the time the gold is brought to the surface of the mines until it is taken over the counter of the Bank of England. The metal is first conveyed from the mines to the banks in Johannesburg, sent by express train to Cape Town, immediately transferred to the Union-Castle steamships, shipped direct to Southampton, where it arrives usually on Saturday morning, and is forwarded in time for Monday's sale of gold. Yesterday \$3,500,000 Transvaal gold was offered in London, the Bank of Germany purchasing the whole amount at 778. 10 1-4d. per ounce, or 1 1-4d. above the statutory mint price. The mine owners derive direct benefit from any advance in the price of their product. About six mining groups control the industry.
