POSTSCRIPT.

During the period that this work has been in progress, several changes have taken place, to which we beg leave briefly to refer.

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.—The death of the Hon. Horatio Gates occurred at Montreal on the 11th April, which also creates a vacancy in the offices he held, as one of the Trustees of the New Market Place in Commissioners' Street, and one of the Commissioners of the Lachine Canal, also a member of the Board at Montreal for examining persons applying for Commissions as Inspectors of Ashes or Flour and Meal.

AUDITOR GENERAL.—Thomas A. Young, Esq. has been by His Excellency the Governor in Chief removed from office, and, in consequence, is no longer a member of the Board of public officers appointed for the inspection of the public treasure in the vaults of the Receiver General, nor an officer having charge of one of the keys of the public vault.
