

## DAILY AVERAGE 928 AT PLAYGROUNDS

### Association Decides to Have Children Give Exhibi- tions at Fall Fair

There will be a playground booth again this year at the annual St. John exhibition and a picked group of young people will perform before the grandstand each afternoon, demonstrating the physical instruction given by the playgrounds leaders during the summer. This was decided on at the regular meeting of the association yesterday. Frank T. Lewis, president, was in the chair and the meeting was enthusiastic over the projected plans for the closing and exhibition work.

There has been formed within the playgrounds a junior baseball league, of which Edward Dalton, one of the male leaders, is chairman, elected by the leaders at a special meeting. It was decided at yesterday's meeting to have the best two teams at the close of the season play off a final game, on or about Aug. 19, when a prize will be awarded the winning team.

The closing of the grounds will be held in a different manner from other years, the small children's closing being held on each ground the morning of the first day. The boys' game and general exhibition will be held on the East End ground on the afternoon of that day and the girls will have their closing in the City Hall, West St. John, on the afternoon of the second day.

There was much favorable comment on the manner in which the children had entered into the play spirit of the recreation centres. This was partly due to the almost unbroken fine weather and to the institution of two special play leaders, Miss Gertrude Wilson and Miss Hazel McCready, as well as the wise choice in the selection of male play leaders. The work done in handicraft will not be so plentiful as last year, but is excellent. The best samples will be exhibited at the booth.

Messrs. W. Kenneth Haley, J. H. Hamilton and Captain A. J. Mulcahy were appointed a committee to assist the male leaders on closing day in the races and special stunts for the boys. The ladies of the association, headed by Mrs. A. M. Belding, were appointed to take a share in the care of the booth at the exhibition Aug. 30-Sept. 6. Miss Emma L. Heffer, general superintendent of the playgrounds, will be in charge, assisted by the various lady leaders.

Miss Heffer reported an average daily attendance of 928 for the season so far. Since the last meeting she made 40 visits to the centres.

It was decided to forward an expression of sympathy to Mrs. J. I. Dooly in her recent bereavement in the death of her son in California. D. L. McRoberts was authorized to put away the playgrounds apparatus when the closing time arrives in about two weeks.
