MARITIME DELEGATES HEARD AT OTTAWA

Ottawa, June 10—A large delegation of twenty or more from the maritime provinces is here interviewing the government on matters connected with freight rates on the Canadian National Railways.

The delegation represented the maritime boards of trade and the maritime section of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association and included the following: W. S. Fisher and L. W. Slings, St. John; J. D. Palmer, Fredericton; A. D. Gannon, St. Stephen; Angus Macleod and B. M. Mullins, Bathurst; Captain J. E. Masters, J. A. Marvin, F. E. Denison, Moncton; H. R. Silver, R. E. Finn, C. R. Hobin, E. H. Armstrong, Halifax; Mr. Thompson, Amherst; C. J. Burchell, Sydney.

After discussing with maritime province representatives matters relating to management and policy of the Canadian National Railways including freight rates and removal of officials to Toronto they met the cabinet together with the minister of railways and D. B. Hanna and placed their views before them.

They particularly urged equalization of freight rates from the maritime provinces to Montreal in summer for export trade to Halifax and St. John in winter. They urged that all rates be carefully gone into.

The present fear of discrimination has arisen from the fact that Sir Henry Drayton has ruled that all rates must be on a mileage basis, irrespective of geographical situation which would work a hardship on the lower provinces. There is an appeal from the traffic manager in such cases to the railway commission and finally to the governor-in-council. The delegation received considerable encouragement but no definite assurance as the matter is left with the railway management for the present.

MARITIME PROVINCES STOCKYARD PROJECT.

(Fredericton Mail).

The project to establish stockyards in the maritime provinces has progressed another step. A meeting of representatives of the three maritime provinces has been called for June 17 at Amherst, N. S., and the project will be thoroughly discussed there and a decision concerning a site reached. Livestock men from all sections of the provinces are to be asked to attend and also dealers and producers. The agricultural departments of the provinces will be represented. E. P. Bradt of this city, deputy minister of agriculture, will represent New Brunswick officially.

Reports and recommendations from D. M. Johnson of Winnipeg, stockyards expert of the dominion agricultural department, who examined proposed sites and conditions in the maritime provinces a few days ago, are to be received at this meeting.
