SAYS WESTERN BABIES EXCEL THOSE OF EAST

Spokane, Wash., Aug 22-So far do Spokane country babies surpass the specifications for the standard eastern infant that the standard heretofore used may have to be changed, according to Dr. William L. Hall, who has the scores of 227 youngsters already entered in a "better babies" contest to be held in Spokane in the week commencing September 15.

"I have the measurements of the ideal babies, as adopted by the recent New York competition," said Dr. Hall, "and I find that our western babies are taller, heavier, have greater chest measurements and in other respects outside the records set in the east.

"When we have completed our examination of the thousand or more husky infants that will be sent in from the surrounding farming districts, I believe we will show the world that the west is the home of the perfect baby."

The balance sheet shows that of the sum of £28,000 raised by the subscriptions of supporters, no less than £22,211 was spent in the year just ended on salaries of staff and organizers.
