

BANK SHORT \$223,000, CLOSES ITS DOORS

Rapid progress is being made with developments in transport in North Africa, says the British Export Gazette. It is but a few months since a party of intrepid Frenchmen accomplished the journey of 1,500 miles between Algiers and Timbuktu by motor car.
