THEY PAY ONE CENT TO THE BELL.

And This Was the First That Was Paid to the Bell Telephone Company for the Use of Their Lines.

The Canadian Gazette publishes this report of proceedings in the London bankruptcy court before Mr. Registrar Linklater in re Stewart Brothers. The failure in this case, which came before the court on Tuesday, occurred in March, 1887, the bankrupts trading as timber merchants in Fen court, city, and in Canada, and they now applied for their discharge. It appears that profits had been made for \$102,394, in addition to which the trustee has notice of claims amounting to \$121,400, and the assets have at present realized \$2,700, and have yielded a dividend of 31c. in the pound.

The bankrupts began business in partnership in 1878 with a capital of about \$40,000, and the official receiver reported that they had brought in their failure by rash and hazardous speculation, and that they had given an undue preference to the New Brunswick trading company.

Mr. S. Wolf said that he appeared for the trustees for Messrs Barclay, Bevan & Co., and other creditors, and he alleged the bankrupts had committed other offences besides those which were mentioned in the official receiver's report.

Mr. H. Reed appeared for the bankrupts, and J. C. W. W. Garrett, and Mr. Tatham on behalf of the creditors. The case having been opened, it was found that the hearing would probably occupy a considerable time and ultimately an adjournment was ordered until the 10th inst.
