I. ORIGINAL ENDOWMENT, 1811.

THE HONOURABLE JAMES McGILL, by his last Will and Testament, under date 8th January, 1811, bequeathed the Estate of Burnside, situated near the City of Montreal, and containing forty-seven acres of land, with the Manor House and Buildings thereon erected, and also the sum of ten thousand pounds in money, unto the "Royal Institution for the Advancement of Learning," constituted by Act of Parliament in the Forty-first Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, to erect and establish a University or College for the purpose of Education, and the advancement of learning in the Province of Lower Canada, with a competent number of Professors and Teachers to render such Establishment effectual and beneficial for the purpose intended, requiring that one of the Colleges to be comprised in the said University, should be named and perpetually be known and distinguished by the appellation of "McGill College."

II. SUBSCRIPTIONS TO ENDOWMENT FUND, 1856.

At a meeting called by a number of the influential citizens of Montreal, and held at the Merchants' Exchange, 6th December, 1856, for the purpose of taking into consideration the financial condition of the University of McGill College, the following Resolution was adopted:—
"That an effort ought to be made for increasing the endowment of McGill College, in such a manner as to extend its usefulness, and to place it for the future upon an independent and permanent footing."
Whereupon in pursuance of the above Resolution, the following donations

were enrolled for Special or General objects connected with the University,—The Royal Institution granting Scholarships in perpetuity ac-

cording to the value of the donations.
