Vienna, Jan. 12 (via Amsterdam to London, Jan. 13.)—The Austrian official communication issued today, says:

"The enemy's attempt to force the Nida river (Southern Poland) was renewed yesterday with violent artillery fire. On the entire front in the southern portion in the forencon strong hostile froces renewed their attack, which soon collapsed, under our artillery fire. Hundreds of dead or wounded were left in front of our position.
"Simultaneously an artillery battle took place south of the Vistula. On this occasion one of our batteries succeeded in getting the range of a farm, and the Russians who had been there for some days were compelled to evacuate their positions."




