N. B. NEWS DAILY SHARE ON THE MAP U. S. NEWS OF GREAT TO ENTENTE

Nebraska, Climbs on the Wagon As Do Fall River, Haverhill and Other Massachusetts Cities.

Boston, April 30—Nearly three hundred saloons in this State closed to-night. They were all voted out of business under the local option law. The saloons are in Fall River, Fitchburg, Haverhill, Leominster North Adams and Taunton. All of which are in the dry column.

Nebraska Now "Dry"

Lincoln, Neb., April 30—Nebraska climbed onto the wagon to-night, and John Barstow was elected from the State of William Jennings Bryan. The State favored prohibition last November by 26,000 majority.

The prohibition amendment provides that on and after tomorrow the manufacture, the sale, the keeping for sale or barter under any pretext, of male, spirituous or other intoxicating liquors are "forever" prohibited in Nebraska, except for medicinal, research, mechanical or sacramental purposes.

Soldiers Under Ban

Norwich, Conn. April 30—The Norwich Retail Liquor Dealers' Association, has voted not to sell liquor in any form to men wearing the uniform of the United States Army or Navy or National Guard.

LUMBER BUSINESS ON ST. CROIX DULY

Calais, Me., April 30—From present indications it would appear that very little lumber will be manufactured on the St. Croix in this vicinity at least, until well into the summer. The Murchie steam mill at Milltown, which is modestly equipped, will not be operated at all this season, it is said, and the mills owned by H. J. Eaton & Sons will not be started until the second week in June. The Todd mill owned by the Eaton company in Milltown, N. B., started to-day, and this is the only one on the river hereabouts that is in readiness for business. Ordinarily saw mills at Calais would be in full operation at this time of the year, giving employment to a large number of men and boys, and the present stoppage of these plants means that the employees will be obliged to seek work elsewhere.

GERMAN BOYS AS GOOD AS GERMAN MEN IRISH QUESTION BROUGHT UP IN COMMONS

One Old Soldier Says Class of 1919 Not Too Young—All Teutons Now Only Targets for Gun Fire.

British Headquarters in France, via London, April 30—(From a Staff Correspondent of the Associated Press.)—There are increasing evidences daily of how the German higher command is using the name of Field Marshal von Hindenburg in an effort to sustain the morale of the German fighting men, which was lowered by the recent destruction of the Somme and the successful launching of the British and French offensive actions. Prisoners recently taken also tell how von Hindenburg continues to be held up to the German population as the man in whom it must repose confidence and hope of final victory.

Class of 1919 Called.

The German class of 1919, it is learned, is being called up, but is still in training.

Can Stop Bullets.

One old German soldier, who was taken prisoner on Saturday, was asked if he thought the boys of this class were too young to make good soldiers. He replied with some heat: "No, they are just as good an age as any other for cannon fire, and that's all we are now."

Girl Killed Father BUT IS AT LIBERTY

Boston, April 30—Miss Grace Gansel, of Lynn, who was indicted for shooting and killing her father, Gaetano Gansel on December 9, 1916, has been placed on probation after pleading guilty to a charge of manslaughter. Miss Gansel is 20 years of age. The girl's father ordered her to earn her living in the streets. In a quarrel she shot him.

U. S. MAY APPROPRIATE TOTAL OF \$2,699,485,291.

Washington, April 30—Appropriations of \$2,699,485,291 to meet urgent deficiencies in the army and navy, or \$780,855,887 less than was recommended by the war and navy departments, are included in a bill favorably reported to the house today by the appropriations committee.

RECRUITING IN U. S.

Washington, April 30—Figures made public today for April 28 and 29 show that the total recruits prepared for the two days from all states was 1,436, making 37,290 men added to the army since April 1.



