Energi is considered one of the small-
est vessels engaged in trans-Atlantic
trade.

Several Vessels Sail.
The schooner F. C. Lockhart sailed
yesterday for Guadeloupe with a full
cargo of deals and has been chartered
for a return trip with a cargo of mo-
lasses. The schooner Emily F. Nor-
tham went out, bound for the United
Kingdom, with a cargo of deals and
the schooner L. L. Hamelin also sailed,
lumber laden, for New York City.

Now at Montevideo.
The term schooner Avon Queen (first
named the Jessie Louise Fougler)
which made her maiden trip from this
port last spring, is now at Montevideo
discharging a cargo of hard pine load-
ed at a gulf port.

Will Bring Coal Here.
The four-masted schooner Asia, now
in New York, has been chartered to
bring anthracite to this port and will
load deals here for the United King-
dom. Nagle and Wigmore are the local
agents.

Loading Plaster.
The schooner Lavolta sailed yester-
day morning for Hillsboro, N. S., to
load plaster for New Haven, Conn.

Fifteen Days from N. Y.
After a fifteen-day trip from New
York, the four-masted schooner Tifton
arrived off the island yesterday after-
noon. She is in ballast and will load
deals here for the United Kingdom. W.
M. McKay and Co. are the local
agents.

Sails Today.
The R. M. S. P. Chiswick has fin-
ished loading local freight at the Pet-
tingill wharf and will probably sail
this morning for Halifax to finish load-
ing for the West Indies.

Ready for Sea.
The two ocean steamships loading
grain at this port for the United King-
dom, the S. S. Mackintosh and the
War Capital, are both ready for sea
and are expected to sail Monday night
or early Tuesday morning.

RAIN CHECKS THE FOREST FIRES IN MICHIGAN
Escanaba, Mich., July 25—Rain fall-
ing today checked the majority of
fires in the woods throughout the up-
per peninsula of Michigan. Reports
of serious losses from forest fires
have been exaggerated except in a
few isolated places, forest officials
said.

Shingleton, a small town near Man-
istigue, was threatened yesterday but
the fire was confined to the cut over-
lands. Two other villages, neither
having more than a dozen dwellings,
are said to have been destroyed by
the fire.
