Ottawa, Ont., March 7.—The announcement of the Harding cabinet has produced a splendid Impression in Canada, especially among business and financial men. This is particularly true of the selection of Herbert Hoover as secretary of commerce. Canadian confidence in Hoover is strong because Canadian business men realize he is a big man, and because his international experience will cause him to take a broad view of trade relations with other countries. There also is a beffet that he will ultimately realize the new relations that have been brought about since 1914 between the United States and other countries. A marked extension of American commerce under his direction is expected.
