The Grand Master in his address reviews most faithfully and minutely the transactions of the past year.

He decided that an applicant, whose left leg was $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches shorter than the right, did not possess that perfection of external manhood essential to the qualification of every candidate for Masonry.

Also, that a person with but one eye was ineligible.

Refused to grant dispensations to confer degrees in cases claimed to be those of "emergency."

The D. D. G. Masters whose reports are submitted, appear generally to have done their work of inspection faithfully and conscientiously. One of them however has been called to book, for reporting on the Lodges of his District without having made the necessary visitations.
