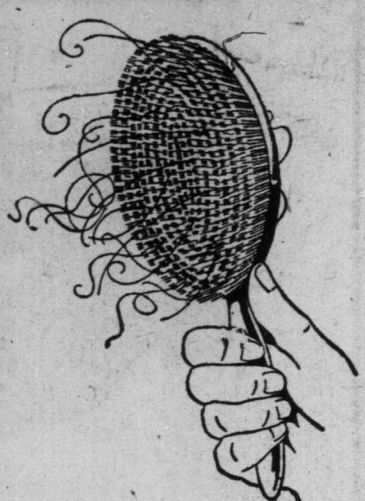

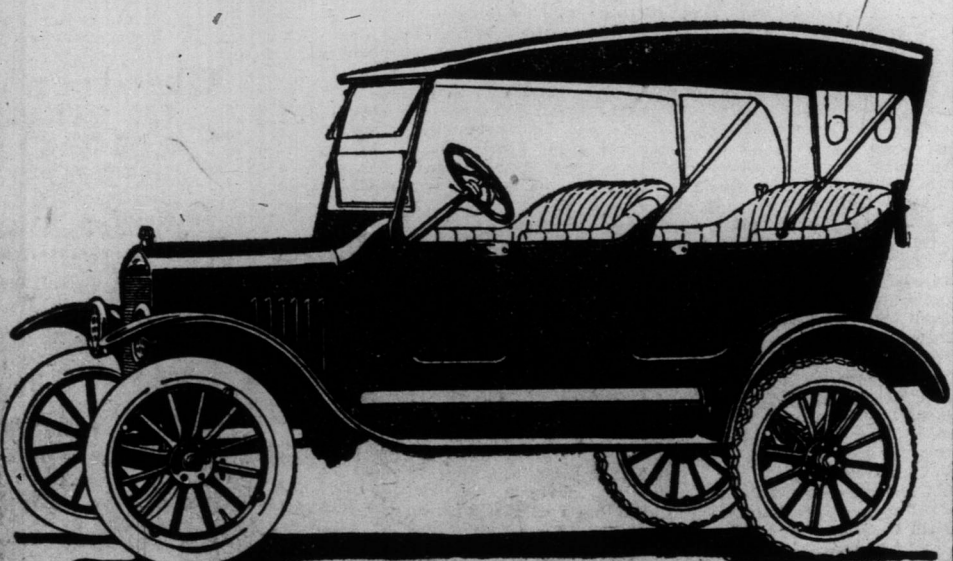

ROTARIANS ATTEND SERVICE AT FIRST METHODIST CHURCH

Dr. Peever Says Every Minister Should Belong to the Rotary Club.

"He profits most who serves best," the motto borne on the escutcheon of the Rotarians, formed the basis of a powerful sermon preached Sunday night in First Methodist Church by Rev. R. G. Peever, the occasion being the annual church service of the local Rotary Club members, who were given the seats of honor in the centre of the church.

Quoting from Luke xii. part of verse 27, "I am among you as he that serveth," the words of Jesus, the Master Rotarian, when his disciples sought to know who was greatest amongst them, Dr. Peever declared that the service of humanity was an essential element of a complete understanding of the fullest and completeness of life.

Welcomed Rotarians. He extended a hearty welcome to the Rotarians present, and, referring to the three and a half years' membership of the club declared that he had been greatly impressed by the spirit of comradeship, the inspiration and the wonderful way in which anything in which the Rotarians interested themselves was "put across." "In fact, I think," he said, "that every minister should be required by his congregation to be a member of the Rotary Club and the Chamber of Commerce—the congregation should of course pay his way—so that he may be in contact with every-day affairs, with what men are thinking and learn their different viewpoints."

Dr. Peever also expressed the opinion that the "late arrival bell," a feature of Rotarian gatherings, might not be amiss in some churches. "What better message can I give you tonight," he asked, "than this, 'I am among you as he that serveth.' It expresses four ideas, fellowship or comradeship, service, responsibility and reward, nothing can rob life of these factors."

A Man Among Men. "I like to think of Jesus as a man among men, a normal man, meeting each situation and daily difficulty of human life as it arose, helping others and injecting the spirit of joy and helpfulness into all with whom He came in contact. Jesus never offered an apology. He was a perfectly normal man. He never made Himself conspicuous. He stood foursquare to the world."

"The Bible knows nothing of the solitary man; every man is not only his brother's keeper, but his brother's neighbor. Fellowship means life; solitariness means death. The perfect life was exemplified by Jesus. He understood the hunger of man for the companionship of his kind."

PRESBYTERIANS MAKE THE BEST POLITICIANS
Quite an interesting discussion on "The Christian and Politics," under the leadership of Hon. W. C. Sutherland, ex-speaker of the Saskatchewan Legislature, featured the meeting of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church Brother-hood Sunday morning.

Christ, he said, advised that the laws of the land be observed as well as the laws of God. "Christ was not a political reformer," he added.

"Is it right for Christians to take part in politics? Who are most likely to resist temptation?" asked the speaker. The trouble with Canadian politics was the system of bribery and corruption. It was a hard thing to control. "Put the kind of men in Parliament who will not be influenced," was Mr. Sutherland's advice.

"The question is, 'Shall a Christian allow anyone else to represent them in politics?'"

ORGANIZED SOCIAL UPLIFT CAUSE OF WORLD SUFFERING

Too Much of It, Says Canon Almond, Denouncing Materialism.

Declaring that organized social uplift is one of the principal things from which the world is suffering today, and that the world's real salvation is to be found only through Jesus Christ, Rev. Canon (Col.) Almond, C. M. G., of Montreal, at Croydon Memorial Church, Sunday, made a stirring denunciation of present-day materialism and selfishness.

"I have been traveling over the eastern part of Canada recently and have had opportunity to make wide observations of the social conditions. I am not much impressed," he said, "How people are to be awakened I don't know, but they must be. We are living in the most tremendous years that ever God called upon men to live in, but many so-called Christians are mere spectators. They are not in the struggle at all."

Ought to be ashamed. "Take your own church. Look at the empty seats. You ought to be ashamed. London could not be a better example. I would just as soon betray Jesus Christ himself as the 60,000 Canadian crosses in France, and that is what we are doing."

Canon Almond asserted that the various forms of modern social uplift were not sufficient. The saving power of religion is Jesus Christ, and every man must carry his cross, he said. Recently at the Rideau Club in Ottawa, he heard an officer express the opinion that the one thing that is hurting the world is nothing more or less than organized social uplift.

"I believe him," he declared. "It hasn't the power to lead to the altar, whatever else it may do. It is like an electric car without the power turned on. We have got to make a change. We must put the church of God first. I belong to many organizations in Montreal, the Kiwanis Club and the Rotary Club. I know their members to be first-class men, but isn't it a pity that we have to go outside the church to form organizations. I know that many of these men spend from \$200 to \$300 a year on club dues, banquets, and they give the church about \$25 a year or 25 cents a Sunday. I am 35 per cent church and 65 per cent anything else you like. You expect the church to go on and say 'What is the church doing?' Whose fault is it we are not doing something? We want to wake up today and to glorify God through his church."

Utter, Absolute Rot. "What utter, absolute rot we are singing to God in this church this morning. You stand there and sang about the hosts of darkness compassing you around and preparing yourself to smite them through your Lenten fast and you know you don't mean a word of it."

Referring to the battle of Paardeburg, in which the Royal Canadian Regiment played such a gallant part on February 27, 1900, marking the beginning of Canada's great military prestige, he said he had been with dying men in their last hours, he had walked with other men as they went to the gallows, and he knew that in spite of all other religion a person might have, he must love God, and that the only means of salvation is through Jesus Christ. When Christ was here he founded a church and told his followers to carry it on. He questioned if they were doing it.

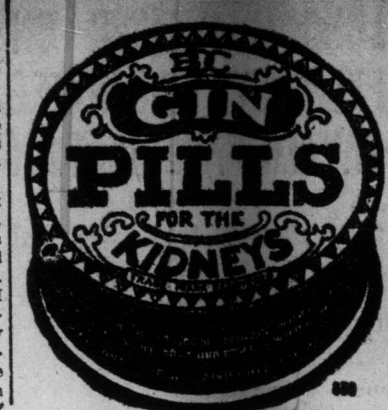
Expressing the belief that God never allowed wealth or other forms of power to remain with one family for two or three generations, he urged the investment of worldly fortunes in humanity through the church rather than making a vain attempt to retain them for succeeding generations.

Surest Passport to Hell. "The surest passport you can give your son to hell is to give him enough money so that he doesn't have to work," he declared.

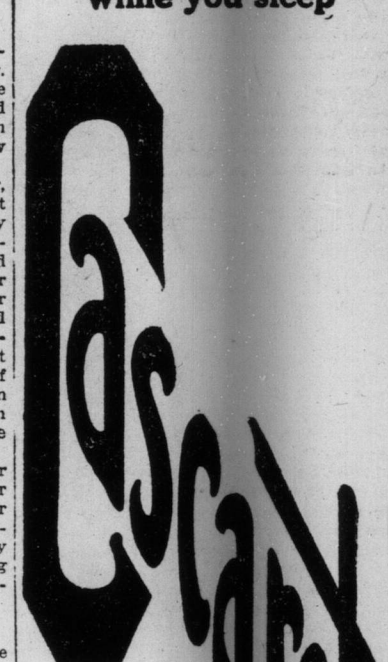
Salvation of the world can only come through suffering, he asserted. He said that Christian Science, Theosophy, Spiritualism, and other religions were all right in themselves, but doubt was bound to come from them. Jesus Christ had gone through this world, and it was better to hold his hand in darkness than to go in the broad daylight alone.

Everything today is reeking with selfishness. A recent session of Parliament which he witnessed at Ottawa, he declared, was paralyzing in its disappointment.

The closing note of his sermon was optimistic, however. He declared his belief in men when they had a high objective and that objective now was the salvation of the world.

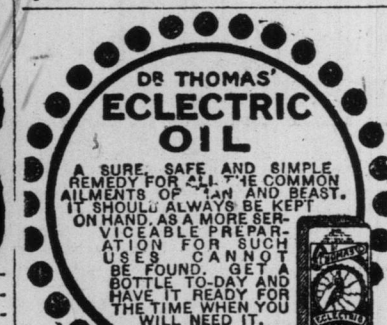
