Grandson of Rev. James McGregor, D.D., Presbyterian minister who emigrated from Perthshire, Scot., in 1786. B. in New Glasgow, 1 Sept., 1838. M. 12 Dec. 1867, Elizabeth McColl of Guysboro. Is a merchant. First returned to Ho. of Assembly at last g.e. A Liberal.—New Glasgow.

McIsaac, Hon. Colin Francis. (Antigonish.)

Family came from Inverness-shire, Scotland. Bro. of Angus McIsaac, Judge of County Court, who sat for Antigonish in the Commons from 1873 to 1885. B. at South River, Antigonish Co., 1856. Called to the Bar N. S. 10 Jan., 1880. Apptd. a Governor of St. Francis Coll., Antigonish, 1882. Apptd. a member of the Executive Council without portfolio 11 April, 1891. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g.e. 1886 and re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal.—Antigonish, N. S.

McKinnon, John. (Inverness.)

Family belongs to the McKinnons of Skye, Scot.
