THE GOVERNOR GENERAL OF THE DOMINION.*

His Excellency *the Right Honorable John, Baron Lisgar*, of Lisgar and Bailieborough, *P.C., G.C.B., G. C. M. G.* B. at Bombay, 31 August, 1807. Ed. at Eton, and Corpus Christi College, Oxford, where he graduated B. A., 1829. Called to the Bar at Lincoln's Inn, 1834. M. Adelaide-Annabella, dau. of the late Marchioness of Headfort, by her first husband, Edward Tuite-Dalton, Esquire. Succeeded his father, the late Lieut. Col. Sir Wm. Young, as second baronet, 10 March, 1848. Created a Peer of the United Kingdom, 8 Oct., 1870. Is a magistrate and deputy-lieutenant for county of Cavan. Was formerly M. P. for Cavan in British House of Commons; and successively one of the junior Lords of the Treasury, from 1841 to 1844, and Joint Secy. of the Treasury from latter date to 1846, in Sir Robert Peel's Administration; Chief Secretary for Ireland, from 1852 to 1855, in Lord Aberdeen's Administration; Lord High Commissioner of the Ionian Islands, from the latter date to 1859; and Governor of New South Wales from Jany., 1861, to Dec., 1867. Appointed Administrator of the Government of Canada 10 Nov., 1868, and Governor General of the Dominion, 29 Dec., same year. (*Salary, £10,000, stg.*) *Bailieborough Castle, Cavan, Irel.; Rideau Hall, New Edinburgh, Ottawa; Spencer Wood, Quebec; Eastern Block.*

* The Right Hon. Viscount Monck G. C. M. G., was Governor General of the Dominion from the Union until Nov., 1868.
