C A P. XLVII.

An Act to permit certain Articles, the Growth, Production, or Manufacture of Europe, to be laden , and thipped on board Ships arriving with Britifb North American Produce, and Fish taken by Settlers in the British North American Colonies, at any Port of Europe, in order to be exported to the principal Ports in the British Colonies and Plantations in North America. [12th May 1809.]

HEREAS it is expedient that the Permission granted by an Act of the Forty-fixth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty, for allowing an Intercourse between the Colonies of His Majesty in North America and Malta and Gibraltar, should be extended to other Parts of Europe; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Fruit, Wine, Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That from &c. of the and after the passing of this Act any Fruit, Wine, Oil, Salt, or Cork, certain Parts the Produce of any Part of Europe South of Cape Finisterre, may be of Europe thipped and laden in any Port or Place whatever in fuch Parts of may be Europe for Exportation direct to the feveral Ports hereafter mentioned; for Exporta-4 N that tion direct to
