C A P. XLVII.

An Act to permit certain Articles, the Growth, Production, or Manufacture of *Europe*, to be laden and shipped on board Ships arriving with *British North American* Produce, and Fish taken by Settlers in the *British North American Colonies*, at any Port of *Europe*, in order to be exported to the principal Ports in the *British Colonies and Plantations in North America*. [12th May 1809.]

WHEREAS it is expedient that the Permission granted by an Act of the Forty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for allowing an Intercourse between the Colonies of His Majesty in *North America* and *Malta* and *Gibraltar*, should be extended to other Parts of *Europe*; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act any Fruit, Wine, Oil, Salt, or Cork, the Produce of any Part of *Europe* South of *Cape Finisterre*, may be shipped and laden in any Port or Place whatever in such Parts of *Europe* for Exportation direct to the several Ports hereafter mentioned;

Fruit, Wine, &c. of the Produce of certain Parts of Europe may be shipped there for Exportation direct to
