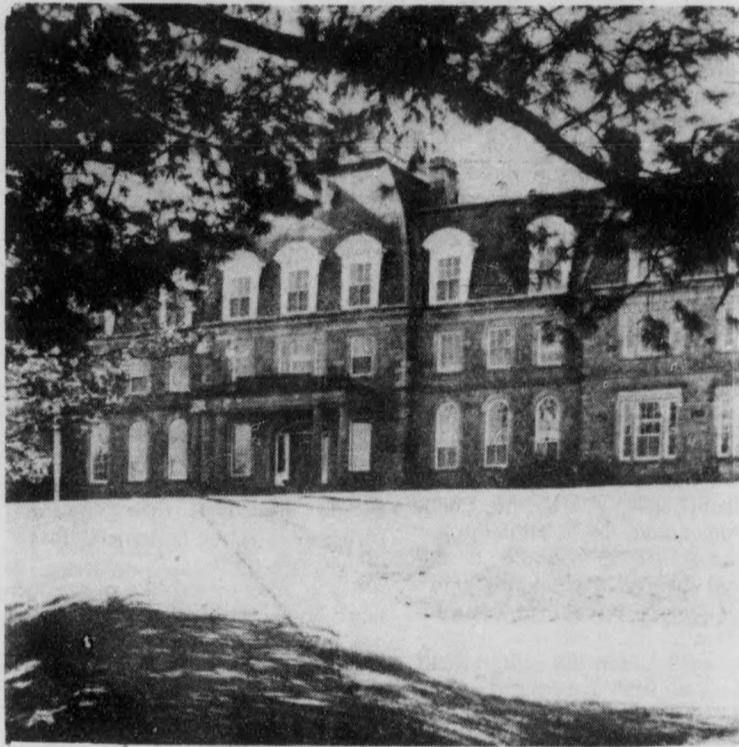


Reviewing yet another year
