Nute (C.44722), Chaplain (P), who was recently posted in on staff from No. 3 "M" Depot. The regular voluntary Sunday morning services in the Airmen's Lounge have been well attended, and an outdoor Wing Church Parade was held on the lawn in front of the Normal School on August 13th. The new Chapel in Athabasca Hall has been suitably equipped with furnishings taken over from No. 3 "M" Depot, and supplies a longfelt need on occasions such as weddings, baptisms, etc., as well as for Holy Communion with the morning services.</p> <p><u>Discipline</u> - during the past month has maintained its high level.
