(Applause.) I am glad we have with us to-day the Honourable William Chisholm, whose spirited fight has holstered up and pressed up the hearts of Liberals all over the Province of Nova Scotia. He has been a great leader. He has fought an uphill fight, but the thing he brags about the most is that those men he has around him---that is to say, the other two---are absolutely disciplined and under control and he can depend upon their vote every time.

I want to acknowledge as well the presence of our good friend Mr. Kelly, whose sage advice is always sought and always desired in connection with public questions; and my good friend Mr. Dwyer, who addressed you briefly this afternoon---a man who is going good, hard work in this constituency at the present time, and who is bearing the burden and heat of the day, in connection with local problems, and bearing them exceedingly well.

These men make it a great pleasure for me to be here; and when I think as well of the fact that we have, in the person of Hon. Mr. Kinley, the newly elected President of the Nova Scotia Liberal Association, a man of atility, of capability and of plenty of energy, and we have, in the person of Mr. Doran, the organizer, a young man who is putting his whole heart and soul into the work, I feel that the future of Liberalism in the Province of Nova
