Memorandum to Mr. Meighen:

Many hundreds of young men in Canada are precisely in the position of your friend, Fulton. He is, it would appear, a Commissioned Officer in the Rocky Mountain Rangers. If or when this N. P. A. N. unit is mobilized as a part of the C.A. S. F., he will have his chance. Meanwhile I am sorry to say that I can suggest nothing of any value to him, except possibly that he should use a typewriter when writing letters in matters of this sort. Nobody cares to read hand-writing nowadays--especially a long letter.

The Government have announced their intention of forming a Third and Fourth Division in due course, or, when the British Government ask for it, and so on. Am inclined to the view that circumstances and events are forcing the hand of the Government, and you may comfort your friend with the thought that possibly in the near future an announcement will be made.
