Memorandum for Mr. King:

Mr. A. S. Rennie, Liberal M.P. for Oxford, telephoned this morning to confirm the arrangements for his telephone call to you, on the afternoon of Monday, November the 8th.

The Bell Telephone Company is opening, on Monday, a new building at Fillsonburg (in Oxford county) and as a part of the opening ceremonies, the first call will be one from Mr. Rennie to yourself. Mr. Rennie states that the conversation will be an informal one with no question of any set message or greetings. It will be a purely private call in every way.

Mr. Rennie will place his call at approximately 3.45 p.m. It will be put through to the switchboard at Queen 4328, whence it can be relayed to you wherever necessary.
