"We demand at the same time that there should be an adjustment made in old age pensions, and in the pensions payable to veterans and widows of the last war and world War I in keeping with the higher cost of living."

Suggested Reply:

In the last session of Parliament the Minister for Veterans Affairs pointed out that it was his intention to recommend the appointment of a Committee to consider the whole question of pensions to veterans and widows of both world wars. As to the demand that there be an increase in the old age pensions, when this matter was before the House last session the Minister of National Health made it clear that the plans advanced at that time should be completed in the light of a fully comprehensive social security plan which it is hoped will be achieved at the earliest possible date. To offend an Old Age Pension alone amounts that have been suggested here and elsewhere by the leaders of the Opposition would throw the whole program off balance and would make such things as medical insurance, hospitalization etc impossible of attainment.
