"I am Captain John J. Wedgewood, Officer Commanding R.B. & D.L. Company, No. 1 Canadian General Reinforcement Unit. Following his refusal to accept an inoculation, the Accused was persuaded before me on orders on 15 NOV 44. I asked him if it was his intention, if he was sent back for an opportunity to take the inoculation, whether he would accept it. He stated that he would not, as long as he lived, take another medical reason for refusing it, and he said 'NO'. Thereupon I remanded him to the Commanding Officer's Orders."
