Dear Sir: -

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your wire from Prince Rupert dated the 12th instant, reading as hereunder:-

"Must have more expense money immediately have advanced own money for past two weeks please wire me one hundred dollars am going Hazelton tomorrow evening."

to which I replied as follows:-

"Have telegraphed Mr. Scott wire money to you care Indian Agent Hazelton."

I expect the Department sent you the amount asked for though by right you should have given an accounting for the \$200.00 already advanced.

It was expected that yourself and other members of the Committee would be through by the 15th of this month at least, though possibly unforseen difficulties may have arisen. It is important, however, that you should all be through by the end of the month and have your reports presented to me and Mr. Scott expects this.

Mr. Reid phoned me last week that he was going to assist Andrew Paull, and that he expected you to return in about ten days' time.

Mr. Teit is still very ill at Spence's Bridge and I am going to see him Sunday or Monday. I leave for the Mainland tonight.

For reasons already given to you it is important that the work should be completed by the end of the month.
