These figures demonstrate other things than the growth of the volume of trade. They demonstrate that while the imports of foreign goods have increased only some \$350,000 in nine years, the inter-Provincial trade has assumed relatively much larger proportions. Beginning with \$150,000 in 1872, it has steadily increased till last year it reached over two millions and a quarter, and this year it is not too much to assert, will reach three millions. Nine years ago the foreign imports were seven times as much as Canadian. Now Canadian goods out-value the foreign by two-and-a-quarter times!

Navigation is still kept up by the Hudson's Bay Co. in Hudson's Bay (Arctic Ocean), some five vessels per year coming in there, but as the outlet of York Factory, at the mouth of Nelson River (the outlet of Lake Winnipeg), is the only port there, in the Winnipeg Customs District, I can only give the figures from there. Its exports, furs mostly, are about \$90,000 to \$100,000, and imports, of course, much less.
