Ordered, That the House do take into consideration the Speech of His Excellency the Governor General on Tuesday next.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Vankoughnet, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Knowlton, it was

Ordered, That two hundred and fifty copies of the Speech of His Excellency the Governor General be printed in both languages for the use of Members.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Vankoughnet, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Knowlton, it was

Ordered, That all the Members present this day be appointed a Committee to consider of the orders and customs of this House and privileges of Parliament, and that the said Committee have leave to meet in this House when and as often as they please.

The Honorable the Speaker acquainted the House that Returns had been received from the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, relative to Members elected to serve in the Legislative Council, under the provisions of the Act intituled, "An Act to change "the constitution of the Legislative Council, by rendering the same elective."

The same were then read by the Clerk as follow:
