CHANGES IN RECRUITING REGULATIONS

Ottawa, July 30—An important relaxation in the regulation regarding the qualifications of recruits offering for service in Canada has been agreed upon by the Militia Council.

A change in the height requirements for 5 feet 4 for infantry to 5 feet 2 and from 5 feet 6 for artillery to 5 feet 4. This will permit many men to enlist who have hitherto been turned down.

A relaxation in the regulation regarding chest measurement, the minimum to be 33 inches. This will be largely at the discretion of the examining officers.
