ANOTHER SOP FOR THE
YANKEES.

Hon. Mr. Blair has ordered fifteen palace cars for the Intercolonial in the United States. The order is a public disgrace. The cars could have been built in Canada if they cost twice as much as in the United States. After the way the Americans are treating Canadians we believe every man, woman and child in this country with any spark about them would prefer to ride on a flat car built in Canada rather than in a palace imported from the other side and upon which no Canadian could get employment.

It is less than a week since Inspector DeBarry, of Buffalo, deported back to Canada Miss Mary O'Connor, a young woman whose home is in Montreal. She was a traveller for J. H. Farr & Co., soap manufacturers, who have establishments both in Montreal and Buffalo. They transferred Miss O'Connor from one establishment to the other, DeBarry, under orders from Washington, promptly transferred her back.

That is the kind of alien labor law the Americans have. Look at ours. There is the London street railway company bringing over "scab" labor from the States to run their cars, and our law is powerless to stop them.

If the Washington government were in power at Ottawa, they could not administer things more in favor of the United States.

When this same Blair wanted three locomotives, he was ordering them from the States. The Grits of Kingston raised such a howl he was compelled to be patriotic for once. Kingston has locomotive shops.

When the government had supplies to send to the Yukon they were sent over Yankee railroads to Seattle, a Yankee port, and loaded on Yankee vessels, by Yankee longshoremen. Then all was paid for by good Canadian money.

A more scandalous "throw down" of Canadian interests under Laurier, Tarte, Blair, et al, has never been witnessed in the history of the Dominion. Yet a subsidized Grit press closes its eyes to all this and never enters a protest. Just watch the Banner, for instance, and see if it doesn't follow the same course it did in the natural gas strike, when Chatham, with Archie Campbell's approval, was so scandalously rebuffed by the action of the government.

AN ENGLISH WRITER ON THE
PLEBISCITE FARCE.

Edward Peggitt, an English journalist, has an article in this month's North American Review on "The Canadian Plebiscite." In his opinion the Ottawa program of which the plebiscite formed a plank, was patterned after the Newcastle program of the English Liberals. The Newcastle program carried the English Liberals into power, but their failure to fulfill their pledges so disgusted the electorate that the next general election resulted in a much more decisive victory for the opposition. It remains to be seen whether the Ottawa program will involve its originators in a like fate. Like the Newcastle program, it went on the plan of promising something to everybody. The English faddists who were tricked by the Newcastle program showed their resentment by turning out the Rosebery government. The Canadian plebiscitists appear to be more easily gulled, if one can judge by their apparent satisfaction with the attitude of Sir Wilfrid Laurier. They will get nothing. should be such as to justify the government in refusing to do anything. In face of the facts Mr. Spence's declaration that prohibitionists "could expect nothing more," is a reflection on the intelligence of the people he represents.

Mr. Porritt, however, is not concerned with the prohibitionists, but with the constitution. He points out the absurdity of the government's position, in that one minister told the electorate the whole prohibition business was a humbug, while another told them they would get it if there was a majority in its favor. From beginning to end there was an air of insincerity about the plebiscite, and a trifling on the part of the Laurier government with representative institutions and long-established constitutional usages. The Canadian people realized this, and rebuked it by refusing to take part in the farce that the government was playing. This also saved the government from getting into an even more difficult position than that in which it had involved itself. Mr. Porritt says quite plainly that he considers the situation a humiliating one for the government. To quote his own words:—

"Since cabinet government and cabinet responsibility for legislation introduced or rejected by government, became established in England, and was transplanted from England to British colonies all over the globe, there never was such a spectacle as was witnessed in Canada during the closing weeks of the plebiscite campaign. The situation would have been more absurd had the vote in favor of prohibition been sufficiently large to demand a prohibition enactment. Then at least three members of the Laurier cabinet would have had to resign, or Canada would have broken away entirely from the cabinet system as it exists in England. With four members of the ministry denouncing prohibition and insisting on its impracticability, it is difficult to see how, without a complete reorganization, the cabinet could have sanctioned a prohibition bill and still remained a cabinet within the accepted meaning of the term as it is used in England, and as it has been hitherto accepted in British colonies with representative institutions like those of Canada."

A MAYOR'S PECULIAR IDEA OF
HONESTY.

They have a waterworks scandal in Ottawa. The collectors and clerks have been taking in rates and crediting them just when they pleased, sometimes weeks after the payments, and this is what Mayor Bingham is reported as saying about the matter:—

"The mere fact of a man being out on a little 'time' and happening to have a few dollars of corporation money in his pocket, spends them for self-gratification, gives us no right to allege that he has disgraced himself. I might do the same thing myself; probably would do so under similar circumstances. A thing that can be so easily rectified is no disgrace."

His worship adds "some people have a wrong conception of what constitutes a disgrace." So it seems. They must have a wrong conception of the criminal code, too, which says the using of other people's money without their knowledge or consent is embezzlement, the penalty for which is imprisonment.

For the month of October the number of emigrants from British ports for Canada were:—English, 1,063; Irish, 78; Scotch, 66; foreign, 912. The number of emigrants to Canada trebles that of similar bookings for Australia during the year, and exceeds the Cape Colony total by 3,842.
