



# RUSSIANS ARE ARE GAZETTED EVACUATING GROUND

Berlin, Sept. 3-It was claimed in an official statement issued here today that the army of Field Marshal von Hindenburg has occupied Grodno the last of the strong fortresses on that line retained by the Russians. It also was claimed that the German troops which are attempting to advance on the Russian port of Riga on the Baltic, have made a further gain by capturing a position northwest of Friedrichstadt, which is about

forty miles from Riga. London, Sept. 3-The evacuation of Grodno is under way. Petrograd has stated officially that the Russians forces are being withdrawn from the right bank of the Niemen. It has been evident for some time that Grand Duke Nicholas had no tention of allowing the number of men required to maintain a long defence to be penned up in any fortress which could be invested.
