As if a mother could "spoil" a son whose father was master in his own house—who took the trouble to study that son's character with half the care he bestowed on the newspaper reports of politics or stock prices after the mischief is done, the descendant of Adam points to the woman as the cause of it.

American fathers are, in a materialistic sense, as good as any in the world. They feel, cloth and warm their children well and cheerfully; and the American boy, regarded as a young animal, has rather a good time.

If he attacks any regular employment when young, it is that he may enjoy his father's money. It is understood that he shall have at least a certain percentage of what he earned for his own enjoyment.

But the mind and heart of the boy are sealed to his father; the father in his paternalistic ignorance, but were he to analyze it further, he would show amazing ignorance.

The boy is a boy—that is all; to be scolded for whistling long, or for doing anything else that may disturb the father; but only a boy. Even the average boy is worth the care and sympathy that a father owes to his son. It ought to be remembered that no one is perfect, either in his superior and inferior. The responsibility of the father cannot safely be thrown upon the best of teachers.

The theory that a boy may be popped in a mill, like a corn, is a little child, and, as a result, ready for use, has been exploded by the sad experience of nearly all who have tried it.

A boy, with a mind quick and eager to grasp whatever comes in its way, is let loose in the world. His father is satisfied as long as he is "quiet." His denure "yes" and "no, sir" is taken as evidence, not only of the most guileless innocence, but also of a mind that can see that he ought not to know. Or he is "smart" and quick, and the father concludes that his "smartness" and quickness are confined to good, not evil knowledge.

It is the fathers who have generally a modest confidence in their own good qualities, to fancy that these qualities will descend to the boy in good time, and save him from the pitfalls of youth.

The father seldom gains the confidence of his son. There is a wall between them. The father sees that the young animal is "well-groomed." He saves the
