Why and Wherefore.

What is the meaning of some of the  
terms used by brokers?

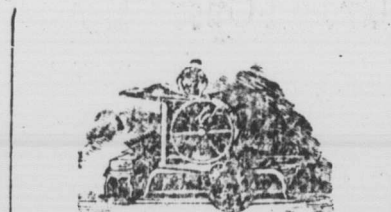
