A 35 Mile Ride to Cost 5 Cents.

Chicago, Dec. 27.—A 35 mile ride
for five cents will be made possible
by the \$70,000,000 merger of all the
surface railway lines of the south
side. According to figures given out
by President Thomas E. Mitten, of the
Chicago City Railway Company, the
average total number of passengers
carried annually on the lines involved
in the railway merger is 240 million.
Of this number it is estimated that
220,000,000 are cash fares and the re-
maining transfers. The various roads
involved in the merger covers 497
miles of railway.

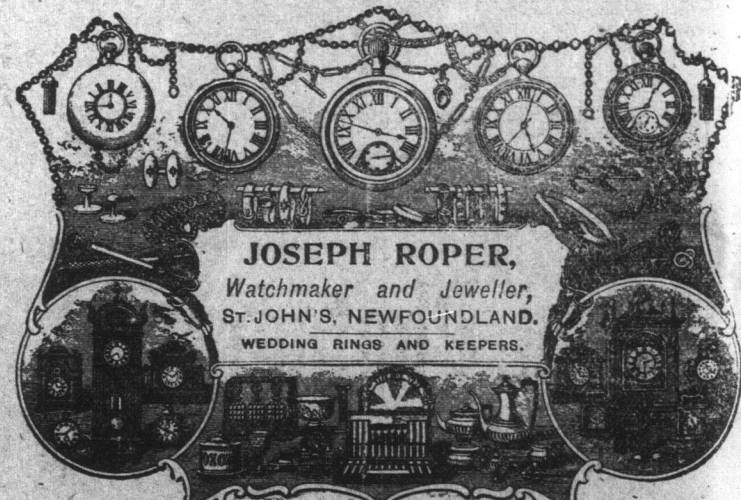

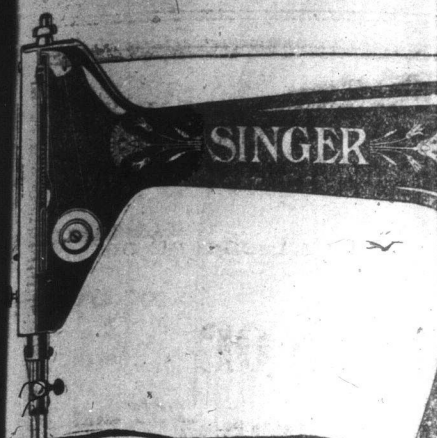
