A BONAPARTE DEAD.

An American Nephew of the Great Napoleon.

Remantic History of His Parents— Yankee Cash Came in Handy.

Boston, Mass. Sept. 8.—Col. Jerome Bonaparte, the well-known American and French army officer, and a grand-nephew of the great Napoleon, who died the other day at Beverly Farms, was a member of the famous so-called "American branch" of the famous so-called "American branch and the great Napoleon, having married Miss Elizabeth Patterson, the daughter of a wealthy Baltimore merchant, Dec. 24, 1803. Jerome was the commander of a French warship and was on a visit to Baltimore at the time when he first met and became enamored of the American belie, who was a woman of great beauty. The marriage was opposed by her parents as well as by the Emperor, the bridegroom's brother, who, although unable to prevent it, was so enraged at a Bonaparte contracting a plebeian union, he ordered that the young wife should not be permitted to set foot on the soil of France. Jerome seems to have been greatly attached to his wife, and for a leng time to have resolved to give up all hope of perferment under the Empire in order that he might live with her. But the Emperor was obdurate, and finally conquered, in this matter as in others, so that a divorce was at length obtained, though the French Senate had already decreed that Jerome's American marriage was null.

Meantime a son had been born to the

Meantime a son had been born to the bouple, July 7, 1805, named Jerome Napoleon Bonaparte. After the separation his mother, with theehild in arms, returned to America. Young Jerome Napoleon Bonaparte grew up, graduated at West Point in 1848, and in 1854 went to France, where his kinsman, then on the throne, commissioned him a major of dragoons and he served in the Grimean war. While in Europe he met Mrs. Leroy Edgar, who had been left at 26 a widow/with \$1,000.000, and married her. She was a granddaughter of Daniel Webster, her father being W. H. Russell, a wealthy New York merchant.

In 1854 Colonel Bonaparte's father, the In 1854 Colonel Bonaparte's father, the second Jerome, was presented with a certificate by the Napoleon then on the throne, certifying that the Patterson marriage was legal, and that Jerome Bonaparte should be "reintegre dans la qualitation of the father of the King of Wartemberg. Pasha's Death Discredited.
Chicago, Sept. 8.—Dr. Carl Peters, the African explorer and German commissioner to East Africa, who has been in the city for several days, last night saw the dispatch announcing the report brought from Ujiji by the Rev. Mr. Swann of the decapitation of Emin Pasha by the Arabs and the eating of his body by caunibals. Dr. Peters was the last white man to see Emin. He met him in 1890 near the Victoria Nyanza, when Emin started on his northwestern route through Africa to the west coast.

"I am not ready to accept the report of Emin Pasha's death," said Dr. Peters.
"Mr. Swann's account differs from the previous ones in that it professes to give details, but to my mind that is no evidence. Since I left Africa last May, which would be about the time that Mr. Swann left Ujiji for the coast, authoritative information had been received that Emin was living peaceably with the Arabs on the borders of the Congo country, avaiting supplies and money to discharge his obligations and return to the coast.
