The unsettled weather early in the week,

markets during the entire week. The bulk of
offerings was wheat, oats, hay and clover,
with the exception of a 20 per cent. of
beans sold at 90c to 100c per bushel.

Oats also found an advance and closed firm
to-day at 85c per bushel. The bulk of

load offered.

Beans sold at \$1 to \$1.10 per bushel.

\$25 to \$45 per head, and calves \$15 to \$25.
Sheep are firm, with sales of the best butchers
at \$4.25 to \$4.50 each, and inferior at \$3.75 to \$4.
Lamb sold at \$2.75 to \$3.50 each. Hogs are
firmer, with sales of the best at 50c to 55c;
good stores at 45c to 50c, and rough at 40c to 45c
per lb.
