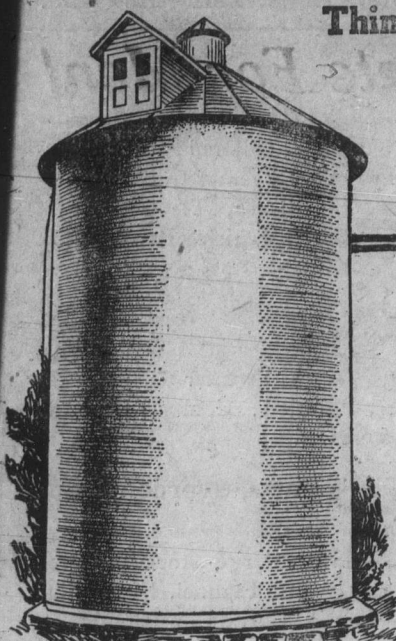

## CAMPBELLTON IS GRATEFUL

Matheson, chairman of the relief committee, has written to Premier Hazen, expressing their appreciation of the government's splendid contribution of \$50,000. As Mr. Matheson points out, the action of the government has lifted a great burden from the tax payers of the stricken town. The letter sent to the premier is as follows:—

Hon. J. D. Hazen, K. C., Attorney General.

St. John, N. B.

Dear Premier—  
At a meeting of the relief committee held here on the 26th of November, I was directed to convey to you their thanks and gratitude for the kindness and consideration you have shown towards our town and its citizens ever since the fire. Your prompt and voluntary offers of assistance to our town tendered on behalf of your government were a great stimulus to our people and aided materially in the work of rebuilding our town.

The splendid contribution of \$50,000 which your government stands ready to make to our town as soon as you are in a position to do so legally, to aid us in paying the interest on our bonded indebtedness, has lifted a great burden from the tax payers of Campbellton. In fact, we as a committee would be quite helpless to perform our duties were it not for the confidence we feel that your government stands behind us ready to confirm all our acts done honestly.

## CONSERVATIVE TOR- ONTO RESENTS MONOPOLY

Toronto Dec. 8.—Following a public meeting in Massey Hall last night called by Mayor Geary to protest against the high handed methods of the Street Railway Company, which has recently introduced the pay-as-you-enter system without providing proper cars, and whose treatment of the citizens of Toronto is something worse than disgraceful, a mob formed on Yonge street and pelted the cars with stones.

In some cases there were women on the cars and they were badly frightened, but so far as learned no one was hurt.

Policemen gathered and used their clubs vigorously on the mob, but the boys in blue were not strong enough and were hustled off in short order. The fight was lively while it lasted and some one will have a lot of glass to pay for. The spirit of the Company was well illustrated by the way in which the motormen drove the cars through the crowd at full speed. There were several narrow escapes from this cause.

## CAATHAM CHURCH NEARLY BURNED

St. Paul's Caught from Overheated Stove—Prompt Work Saved the Building.

St. Paul's church, Chatham, had a narrow escape from destruction Sunday afternoon. Soon after midday the sexton made up the fire in the stove and went to dinner. As the day was cold he had made an extra good fire and the stove became red hot, and set fire to some fuel which was piled at the back of it, which in turn communicated itself to the wall of the building.

This was the condition when the sexton returned to open the church for service at 2.30. It was found that the fire had taken hold between the hearth and the outside wall, and it became necessary to cut away part of the roof in order that water might be poured from above, and in a short time the fire was extinguished. The damage done is not very serious.
