This work has something of the same relation to the great Revival in Ireland, as the "Power of Prayer" has to the American Revival. It is, however, more systematic and full. After giving a brief that the profession of the religious history of the north to Ireland up to 1859, he proceeds to give an account of the origin and progress and results of the revival.
