

**PICTOU COUNTY
AGRICULTURAL EXHIBITION,**

*Open to the Competition of the Province of
Nova Scotia.*

1.—Exhibition to be held on Wednesday, 11th October, in and near the Drill Room, at Pictou.

2.—Premiums to be awarded to competitors for articles of their own growth or production, or three months' possession in case of Stock, unless imported for breeding purposes, and the growth of 1871 if the productions of the soil.

3.—All Entries must be made in writing and forwarded to one of the Secretaries, on or before the 7th of October, after which nothing will be received.

4.—The Secretaries will supply Exhibitors with number to be attached to each article offered.

5.—An Entrance Fee of Ten Cents will be taken at the Drill Room door, at 12 noon, when the public will be admitted. Children half price.

6.—All Stock and other articles for exhibition will be received from 7 till 10 o'clock a. m., when the Judges will begin their work; after which none will be received, except Draught and Carriage Horses, which will not be required before 1 o'clock, p. m.

7.—No article can take two prizes, and all stock and articles exhibited must be taken charge of by their owners, the Committee giving their assistance in procuring the necessary accommodation and doing all in their power to ensure safety.

8.—Stock or other articles on exhibition cannot be removed from the ground without the consent of the Managers, under forfeiture of any prize awarded.

9.—An Entrance Fee of \$2 will be charged all persons exhibiting who are not members of any Society contributing to the Exhibition; and the Secretaries of the several Societies, uniting in the Exhibition, shall furnish a Secretary of the Exhibition with a list of names of Members of their respective Societies, on or before the 5th of October; and persons joining any of the Societies after that date shall not be entitled to exhibit as Members.

10.—The Committee reserve the right of withholding prizes in cases where there is no competition, or the articles are not by them considered worthy of a prize; but articles not mentioned on the Prize List may be exhibited and shall be entitled to honourable mention, as the Judges may determine.

11.—Members of Central Committee, David Matheson, *Chairman*; Donald Fraser, Nelson Sutherland, R. J.; Kenneth Ross, M. B.; Robert McNaughton, Hopewell; James Ives, *Treasurer*; and Jno. McKenzie, Durham, and J. Yorston, Pictou, *Secretaries*.

12.—All cattle must be accompanied by a rope to fasten them securely; and all Bulls must be ringed, with keeper at hand. No provision will be made for Stock not entered for exhibition.
