**STRENGTH OF EUROPEAN
MARKETS ENCOURAGES
BULLS IN WHEAT.**

CHICAGO ALL STRONG.

Chicago, July 6.

Private cables from Liverpool quote wheat strong the decline here yesterday was ignored there. The local talent sold very freely yesterday. The near options are strongest July being particularly so. From the opening of 74½ it eased off to 74 but on the general firm tone developed and judicious manipulation it soon shot up 2½c. The range in September and December options was about one cent closing strong with indications of higher prices for tomorrow; on advance, sell.

Corn seems to be gaining friends the weather of last week was too wet, extreme heat which is now looked for would do the plant harm. Trading was moderate, think it a sale on strong spots.

Provisions showed a good deal of strength pork being in good demand. Outsiders are not much interested in this portion of the pit. Buy lard and ribs for a turn.

Thoman estimates condition:

Winter wheat:—July, 87.8 against 91.2 last month, and 81.5 last year.
Spring wheat:—July, 95.3 against 99.4 last month, 91.5 year ago.
Prospective crop, 685,000,000, against 580,000,000, as proved by last year's distribution.

The above statement goes to prove the high prices obtained for wheat last year induced farmers to greatly increase the acreage.
