We halted an' bivouacked that noight at a place called "MacIntosh's," about 18 miles from Clarke's Crossin', an' on the mornin' ov the 24th we pushed on fer Batoche. We were moving along at a good steady pace, an 'had jist got opposite to a place called Fish Creek, which wuz on the other soide ov the river, whin Bang, Bang, goes the roifles across the river, an' we knew that the Gineril had found what he wuz lookin' fer. Thin came the boom ov the artillery, an'a short whoile afterwards a galloper roides down to the east soide ov the river an' shouted out fer the Infantry fer to come over quick. Well, ye see, No. 1 Company wuz thrown out as an advanced guard at the toune, so Kurnel Grasett orders Captin Mason fer to take No. 2 Company over first. Now this wuz the very chance we wuz lookin' fer, an' ye may be sure we lost no toime in gettin' into shape. We wuz soon packed into the scow an' me an' Lord Melgund an' Liftinint Hays wuz pullin' loike the very divil on wan ov them big oars that wuz cut out ov a tree wid an axe. It took many a long pull an' many a strong pull but we got over in pretty short order considerin', an' scrambled up the steep bank as best we cud. "Well done, Grasett" sez the Gineril, "I didn't expect ye so soon," an' that's all there wuz sed, there wusn't no toime fer makin' purty spaches such as ye read ov in story books, there vuz work to be done. wuz, they wuz down in the ravine well under cover wid the 90th "A" battery, "C" company an Boulton's scouts pumpin' lead into thim from the crest ov the high ground. By the Lord Harry, sor, me heart lept into me mouth like a flash an' I almost let a yell out ov me. 
