There are good possibilities of employment in the fields of health, teaching and informatics. However, since the completion of the Reciprocal Employment Agreement, few spouses have been successful in obtaining a job. The following factors contribute to this lack of success: one requires a good working knowledge of Spanish; the unemployment rate is high; there is strong competition from a qualified Colombian labour force; wages are low; local working conditions are frequently more difficult than in Canada, e.g., a 40 to 44 hour working week.
